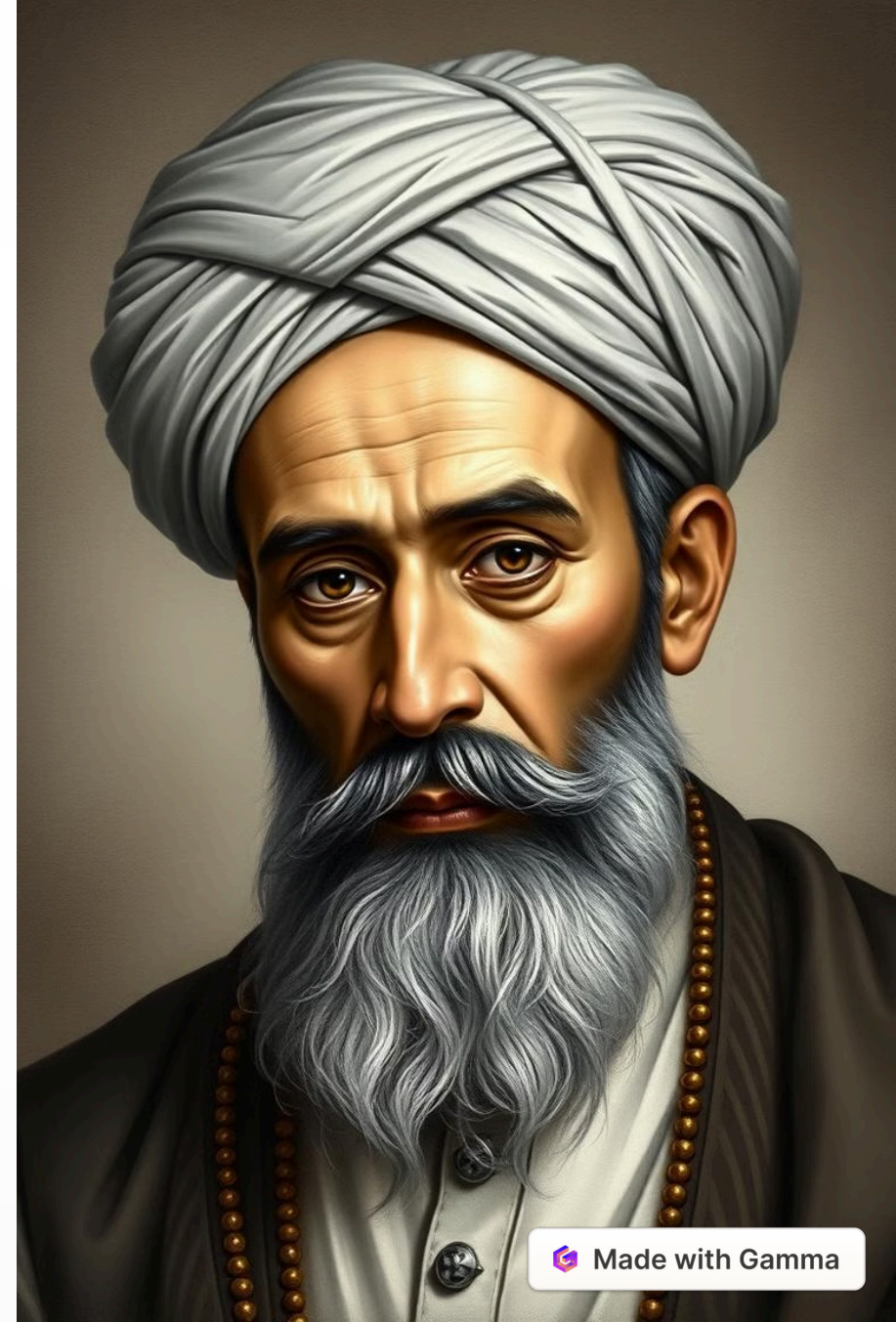


Iltutmish: The Founder of the Delhi Sultanate

From Slave to Sovereign: Iltutmish's Rise to Power

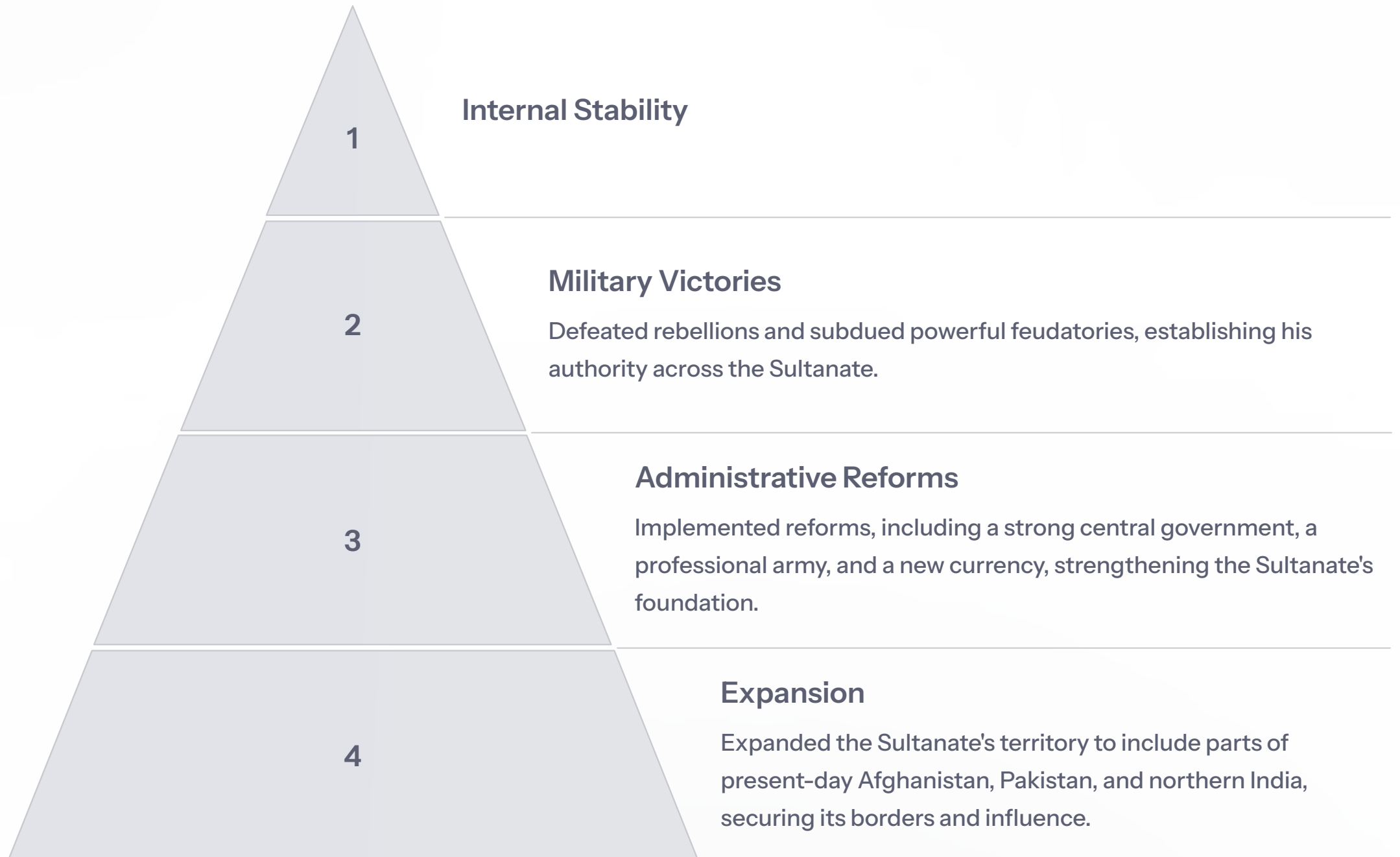
Early Life
