The Concept of Social Control

Maintaining Order

Formal and Informal Mechanisms of Social Control

Formal Mechanisms

These are established rules, laws, and institutions designed to enforce social order. Examples include legal systems, police, and government agencies.

Informal Mechanisms

These are unwritten social norms, values, and expectations that are enforced through social pressure and social sanctions. Examples include social ostracism, gossip, and peer pressure.

Examples

Formal: Laws prohibiting theft, Education, Legislature, Police, Military

Informal: Customs, Folkways, Moors, Religion

The Role of Institutions in Social Control



Legal System

Courts and legal institutions enforce laws and adjudicate disputes. They set clear boundaries and consequences for deviance.



Family

Families are primary agents of socialization, teaching children fundamental values and norms. They provide a framework for behavior and social interaction.



Education

Schools socialize individuals and instill values, norms, and knowledge that contribute to social cohesion and stability.
