Film

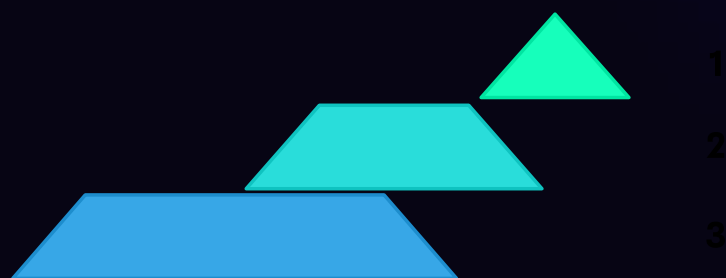
