Defining the Heroic Couplet

What is it?

A heroic couplet is a pair of rhyming lines written in iambic pentameter, a meter that has five metrical feet, each containing an unstressed syllable followed by a stressed syllable.

Key Characteristics

This form is known for its formal structure, its rhyming couplets, and its use of iambic pentameter. It's considered a highly versatile and adaptable form that can be used for a wide range of themes and styles.

The Structure and Rhyme Scheme

1 Structure

Each couplet consists of two lines, usually written as one verse, that together form a complete thought or idea. The lines are typically 10 syllables long, with five iambs per line.

2 Rhyme Scheme

The rhyme scheme is consistent: the two lines within each couplet rhyme, creating a sense of closure and rhythmic flow.

3 Meter

The meter, iambic pentameter, is a rhythmic pattern that creates a sense of formality and elegance.

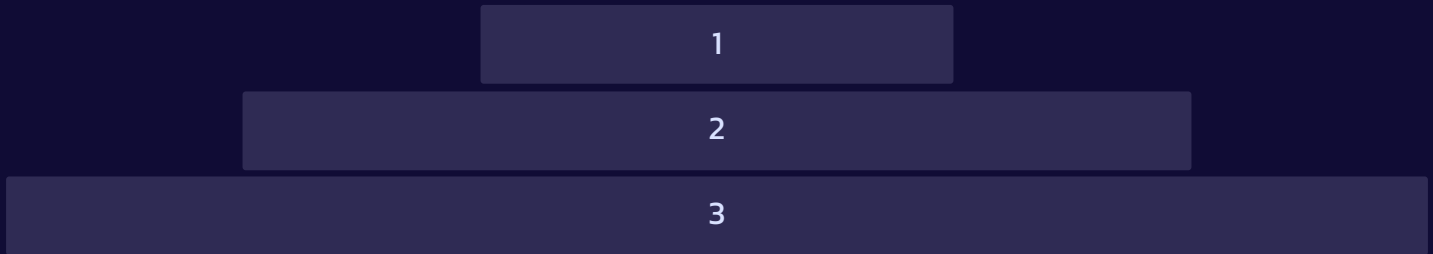

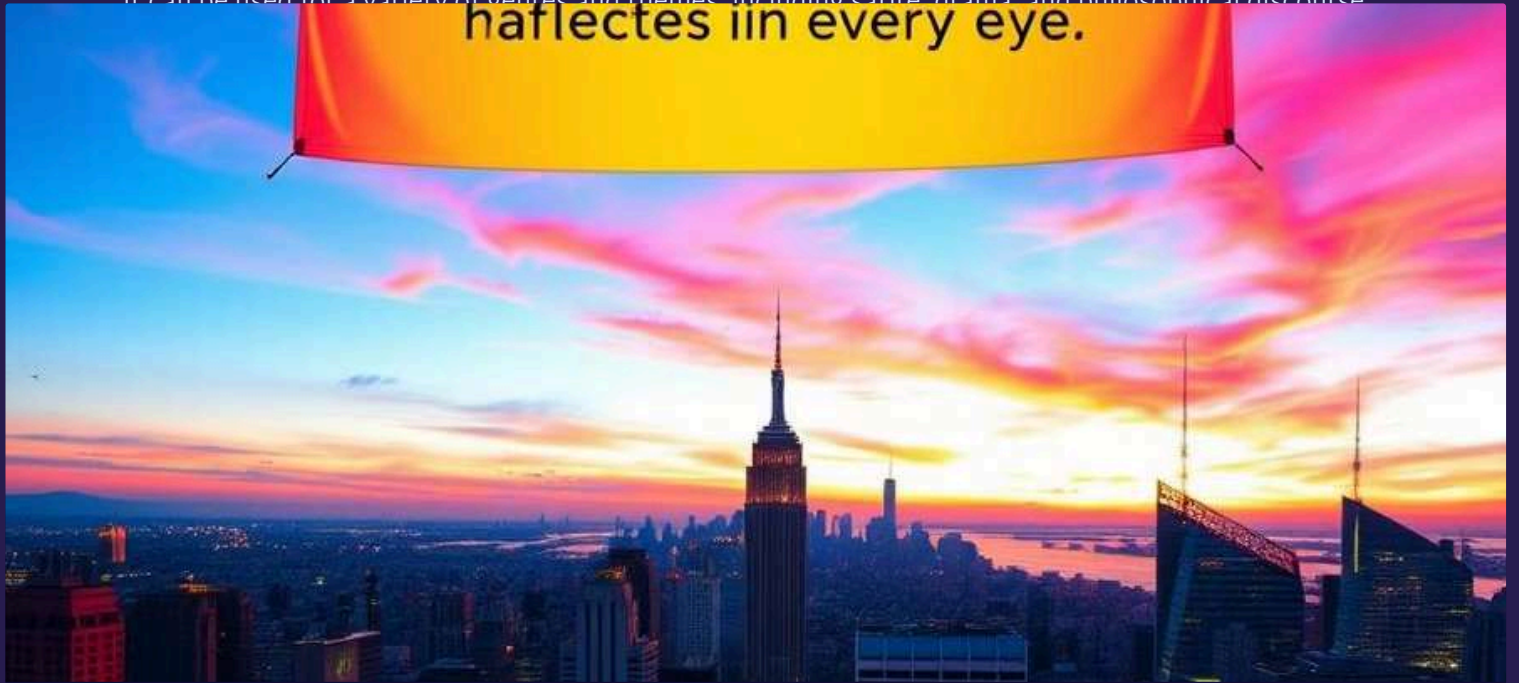
